International Finance Review is an annual book series by Elsevier that publishes theme-oriented volumes on various issues in international finance, such as global risk, emerging markets, international investment and finance, economic and financial integration, currency and capital markets, multinational financial management, and related issues.

The volume on **Multinational Enterprise: Strategy, Structure, and Value Creation**, to be published in 2006, will be Volume 7 in the *International Finance Review* series. It will consider theoretical, empirical, institutional, and policy papers on various issues pertaining to Multinational Enterprise. These include traditional areas in the study of Multinational Enterprises (MNEs) as corporations, but also topics related to Multinational Enterprise as an undertaking, not just as corporation. The goal is to cover Multinational Enterprise from a variety of perspectives, including views from corporations, governments, multilateral agencies, non-governmental organizations (NGOs). We also seek to examine Multinational Enterprise from a variety of disciplines related to international finance, including economics, strategy, management, accounting and taxation, and public policy. The volume will provide a forum for discussion of issues from both academic and practitioner perspectives.

Possible topics to address include, but are not limited to:

- Economic and institutional basis of MNEs
- Foreign direct investments, acquisitions, and modes of entry
- Market reforms, restructuring and MNEs
- Multinational corporate governance
- Value creation by international activities
- Foreign project finance and evaluation
- Capital structure of MNEs
- Interactions between finance and operation of MNEs
- International corporate risk assessment and management
- Taxes, accounting and institutional factors impacting MNEs
- Multinational enterprise and home/host economies and governments
- Multilateral agencies, finance and MNEs
