| Brief description of the special issue: <p>There is a growing consensus that supply and reverse-supply chains should not only be managed efficiently but also achieve sustainability of the global environment. Hence, the initiative for a special issue in green supply chain management (GSCM). Companies such as IBM, Hewlett-Packard, Xerox, and Body Shop International have been involved in green-manufacturing (production-remanufacturing), green-marketing (remarketing), and green-logistics. GSCM coercive requirements from governmental legislation and regulation are found in Europe, Japan, and North America to promote industry-induced pollution alleviation, e.g., by requiring manufacturers to practice green reverse logistics management in recycling used-products.</p> | |
