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## General

- The submitted manuscript conforms to the guidelines set forth in the “Uniform Requirements for Manuscripts Submitted to Biomedical Journals” [www.icmje.org](http://www.icmje.org). The submitted manuscript is in Microsoft Word and in a font of 12 with 1.5 spacing.
- All pages are numbered consecutively, beginning with the title page. Author identification is limited to the title page.
- The manuscript is arranged as follows: 1) cover letter (optional), 2) title page with author contact information, biosketch, acknowledgment(s) and any disclaimers, 3) précis and abstract, text, reference list, tables, 4) figures.

## Human Subject Approval

- Studies involving human subjects include a statement that the study was approved by the appropriate Institutional Review Board and a description of how informed consent was obtained from all subjects in the methods section of the manuscript.

## Keywords

- Three to ten keywords from the list of Classifications that is provided are listed.

## Title Page

- Full title of article contains no abbreviations.
- Authors' names and degrees are listed.
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## Biosketch/Acknowledgment/Disclaimer

- Two to three brief sentences that describe degrees and the current affiliations of each author.
- Acknowledgment of all sources of financial support or potential conflicts of interest.
- A brief acknowledgment of persons who supported the work (optional).

## Précis and Abstract

- A précis is the synopsis of not more than 20 words that appears in the table of contents.
- The manuscript includes an abstract of not more than 200 words concisely stating the objectives, findings, and conclusions of the content in paragraph form.

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- References are identified in the text by superscript Arabic numbers that appear consecutively throughout the text.

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
