Submission checklist for authors

It is hoped that this list will be useful during the final checking of an article prior to submitting it online (www.ees.elsevier.com/bmcl) to the journal's editor for review. Please consult the Guide for Authors at www.authors.elsevier.com/journal/bmcl for further details of any item.

Ensure that the following items are present:

- One author designated as corresponding author:
 - E-mail address
 - Full postal address
 - Telephone and fax numbers
- Cover letter: i) highlighting the novelty, significance and timeliness of submitted work; ii) providing details of other relevant information, e.g. submitted or in press manuscripts.
- Names of potential referees
- All necessary files have been uploaded:
Note: The submission site will convert all source files into one single PDF version of the article for review.
 - Manuscript file – including all figure captions and tables
 - All graphics have been uploaded separately as high-quality files, saved at the exact size for publication
 - Graphical abstract has been submitted as a separate document and graphic has been uploaded separately as high-quality file, saved at the exact size for publication

Further considerations

- Manuscript has been “spellchecked”
- References are in the correct format for this journal
- All references mentioned in the Reference list are cited in the text, and vice versa
- PDB or CCDC accession codes for X-ray structures have been placed in the article
- R¹, R², etc. (not R₁, R₂, etc.) have been used to designate substituents in graphic structures, tables and text
- Permission has been obtained for use of copyrighted material from other sources (including the Web)
- Colour figures are clearly marked as being intended for colour reproduction or to be reproduced in black-and-white
- If using a journal template, note that they contain a large number of macros. To ensure successful PDF conversion, it is important to save the final document as a Word file with a '.doc' extension (rather than the '.dot' extension).
