PURPOSE

The purpose of **TECHNIQUES IN GASTROINTESTINAL ENDOSCOPY** is to provide a comprehensive, current overview of a clinical condition or surgical procedure in gastrointestinal endoscopy, combining the effectiveness of an atlas with the timeliness of a journal. We value your participation as author and provide these guidelines to ensure efficient publication of your contribution. We hope to receive your contribution within 2 months.

PREPARATION OF MANUSCRIPT

“Full length Articles” must be written in **English**, should not exceed **12 double spaced** manuscript pages. Please use an established word processor like e.g. Word or Wordperfect. Manuscripts should be submitted on line: login as an author at <http://ees.elsevier.com/ytgie> and push the button Submit New Manuscript. The article type is **Invited Review Article**.

Title page:

- The title of the article should be short and should not contain any acronyms.
- The authors' names (first name, middle initial and last name of each author) and the institute(s) where the work was done.

- The name, address, telephone and fax numbers, and e-mail address of the author responsible for correspondence.

Abstract

Each manuscript should have a brief abstract of 150 to 250 words in length. The abstract should be descriptive, narrative, and informative. The abstract need not be structured. It should contain only standard abbreviations and no references.

Keywords

About five keywords (do not use words that are mentioned in the title).

Abbreviations

All abbreviations and acronyms used in a manuscript must be explained in full when first used in the Abstract, and again when first used in the body of a manuscript. Authors should try to restrict the use of abbreviations/acronyms to the most commonly used terms

All abbreviations will be listed either as a footnote (< 10 abbreviations), or in an abbreviation box (> 10 abbreviations) following the Abstract and Keywords. Please provide a full list of abbreviations and definitions used in your review

Conflict of interest:

At the end of the text, under a subheading "Conflict of Interest statement" all authors must disclose any financial and personal relationships with other people or organizations that could inappropriately influence (bias) the content of this article. Examples of potential conflicts of interest include employment, consultancies, stock ownership, honoraria, paid expert testimony, patent applications/registrations, and grants or other funding. If there is **no conflict of interest** this **must be stated as:** *Conflict of interest statement: None*

Reference Format

Reference system and style

PLEASE USE THE VANCOUVER SYSTEM AND PRESENT THE REFERENCES ONLY IN THE STYLE DESCRIBED BELOW

Journal titles should be abbreviated according to *Index Medicus*.

Reference numbers in the text follow numerical order and are enclosed in parentheses or put in superscript. References are listed in the order in which they are referred to in the text, not in alphabetical order; they must follow the style of the samples that follow. Please note that manuscripts in press may be referenced; however, manuscripts that have been submitted for publication but not yet accepted should not be referenced.

No TGIE-style is as yet available for Endnote. The closest available approximation is the style for "J Thoracic Cardiovasc Surg.ens". Please use this style when your references have been prepared in Endnote.

Tables

Tables can be uploaded as word processor or separate spreadsheet files. Tables are to be numbered with Arabic numerals (Table 1, Table 2) in order of their text citation and each table must be cited in the text. Each table, with an appropriate brief legend, comprehensible without reference to the text, should be put on a separate page.

For footnotes, use superscripts 'a', 'b', 'c', etc., not asterisks or other symbols.

Figures (maximum 2 colour figures)

The Journal has a color art budget and only a limited number of pages will show color illustrations. The Guest Editor will determine which images will be printed in color in the Journal. For each contribution not more than two color illustrations will be reproduced for free in color in the printed version of the journal. Additional color figures in the printed journal have to be paid for by the author. The number of color illustrations in the on line version of the publication on the Journal's website www.techgiendoscopy.com and on Science Direct is not subject to a restriction.

All illustrations must be cited in sequence in the text and uploaded as separate source files. The legends for illustrations should be listed on a separate page in numerical order and should contain brief but comprehensible explanations. The preferred formats for figures are eps and tif; jpg, pdf and xls are also acceptable

Figure legends are to be numbered in Arabic numerals (Fig 1, Fig 2). Legends should be sufficiently detailed to allow understanding without reference to the text.

If any illustration has been previously published, a copy of the letter of permission from the copyright holder must accompany the illustration. The source of the illustration should be included among the References to the paper. The figure legend should conclude with "Reprinted with permission" followed by the reference number:

Before you send us your artwork, make sure you can answer 'yes' to the following:

- My files are in the correct format - TIFF, EPS or PDF. MS Office files (Word, Powerpoint, Excel), or Wordperfect files are also accepted, provided they meet certain conditions. For more information, go to <http://www.elsevier.com/artworkinstructions> and click File Formats.
- My color images are provided in the RGB colorspace.
- The physical dimensions of the artwork match the dimensions of the journal to which I am submitting.

PROOFREADING

The first author is sent galley proofs by email and asked to proofread them for typographical errors, returning them to the publisher within 48 hours. Important changes in data will be accepted, but authors will be charged for excessive alterations in proof.
