Special Issue title: The Impact of Academic Globalization on E-Learning

The Internet and Higher Education invites papers for a special issue on the impact of academic globalization on teaching and learning and to inform readers on the state of global learning innovation and best practices. The challenge is how best to cultivate an online academic culture of global citizenship in which teaching and learning reflect a commitment to investigating, understanding, and engaging the world from multiple cultural perspectives. Manuscripts that address both practical and theoretical issues as they relate to global teaching and learning are solicited. Research in the area of Internet-based global teaching and learning and case studies describing best practices are especially desired. The format can include submission of main articles or brief reports. The brief reports would be short papers that highlight interesting practical perspectives (much like the existing *From the Trenches* section of the journal). Specific areas of interest include:

- Best practices and innovation pertaining to global learning strategies, structures, and programs.
- Issues and innovative solutions in achieving global competence in Internet-based higher education programs.
- Understanding and navigating cultural differences in a culturally diverse virtual classroom.
- Enhancing faculty expertise in global teaching and learning.
- Quality provision in online cross-border higher education.
