Author guidelines

Minireviews are articles on current topics that are especially relevant to human pathology, disease or therapy, focusing on one thought-provoking area in particular. These Minireviews in *Life Sciences* complement original research articles and serve an important role in presentation of complex pharmacological material to a broad audience.

While Minireviews are often invited, unsolicited submissions are also welcome.

As author of a Minireview please read the following instructions carefully.

Word limit:

Please limit your Minireview to approximately **1500–4000 words**.

Graphical abstract:

A graphic giving a **mechanistic summary** (“Graphical abstract”) must be submitted. This graphic should summarize the contents of the article in a concise, pictorial form designed to capture the attention of a wide readership online. Graphical abstracts should be submitted as a separate file in the online submission system. Image size: please provide an image with a minimum of 531 × 1328 pixels (h × w) or proportionally more, but should be readable on screen at a size of 200 × 500 pixels (at 96 dpi this corresponds to 5 × 13 cm). Bear in mind readability after reduction. Preferred file types: TIFF, EPS, PDF or MS Office files. See <http://www.elsevier.com/graphicalabstracts> for examples.

This graphic will be used in the electronic Table of Contents of the respective journal issue.

Audioslides:

Audioslides (i.e. ppt slides with audio recording) can easily be produced using software provided by *Life Sciences*.
