Guide for Volume Editors

Potential Volume Editors who would like to propose a topic for a volume that is within the journal scope, should prepare a proposal as outlined below and then contact the Editor, Martin Dresner at mdresner@rhsmith.umd.edu.

Preparing a Proposal for a Volume

Those wishing to propose a Volume for Research in Transportation Economics should prepare a proposal that:

- Sets out the importance of the area on which the volume will focus.
- Explains the anticipated contribution of the volume in advancing the understanding in this area.
- Identifies papers and authors for possible inclusion in the volume, with a brief description of each paper. A tentative table of contents, with potential contributors, should be included.
- Indicates the schedule in which the volume could be produced.

The responsibilities of Volume Editor(s)

Once the Editor of Research in Transportation Economics has accepted a proposal, it is the responsibility of the Volume Editor(s) to deliver the submissions to the journal within the agreed schedule. All papers for the volume must meet the high standards of the series. The Volume Editor should establish a refereeing process to ensure these high standards. The Volume Editor(s) should keep the Editor informed of the progress of the volume. Once all the papers have been completed, the Volume Editor should submit the papers to the Editor for final approval.
